# Endoscopic Resection of Colorectal Neoplasia

Module 1: The Fundamentals • Thursday 11 October 2018 • Svendborg, Denmark

*Polypectomy of colorectal neoplasia is the most frequently used therapeutic intervention during colonoscopy. To secure that established endoscopists have the skills in this widely used technique, the module 1 programme prepares endoscopists to overcome challenges, gain confidence and demonstrate their “readiness” to perform polypectomy. The course is designed to specifically teach standardized knowledge and skills in colorectal polypectomy. Enrollees will participate in a one-day intensive, standardized training, based on lectures, video cases, device workshop and live demonstration.*

## Target group

### Physicians (in fellowship):

- A minimum of one year in practice during fellowship (proficient in UGI endoscopy)
- Performed 100-150 colonoscopies independently, and currently be performing colonoscopy as part of their fellowship

### Physicians (post- fellowship):

- Early post-fellowship
- Performing colonoscopies independently as part of daily practice

### Nurse endoscopists:

- A minimum of two years in practice as endoscopy assistant
- Finalized their colonoscopy training course (150 supervised procedures)
- Currently be performing colonoscopies independently as part of daily practice

- Select appropriate surveillance intervals based on current guidelines

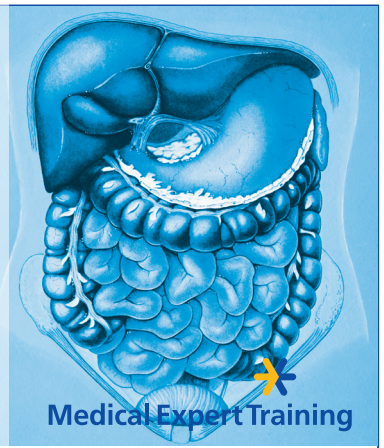
